SUMMARY

This position is responsible for the design and on-site construction of county and township road and bridge projects. Upon occasion this position may supervise one or more technicians and/or season employees. This position reports directly to the County Engineer.

REQUIRED DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES including but not limited to the following:

- Prepare plans and specifications for county and township projects.
- Inspects, reviews and evaluates fieldwork performed by contractors as to ensure conformance with plans and specifications.
- Coordinates construction schedules. Upon occasion this can be multiple schedules.
- Interprets plans and specifications for highway and bridge construction projects.
- Measures and approves work performed by contractors for processing of payments to contractor. Prepare pay estimates in accordance with county and IDOT standards.
- Prepares accurate measurement, computation, and documentation of contract items.
- Have knowledge of Illinois Department of Transportation requirements and specifications relating to the preparation of reports, plans, and proposals.
- Consult with Township Highway Commissioners in providing advice, estimating, design, specifications and supervision services for township road projects.

- Supervise construction inspection of county and township bridges. Test concrete used in bridge construction for air content using air meter. Prepare concrete test cylinders and break cylinders using county's concrete compression testing machine.
- Coordinate design of county and township bridges with bridge design consultants.
- Maintain a current list of construction projects on the county website.
- Maintain a current bridge posting list and map on the county website.
- Performs duties in compliance with departmental safety rules. Performs all duties in a manner conducive to the fair and equitable treatment of all employees.
- Performs other duties as required or assigned.

DESIRED DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Act as Bridge Program Manager. This position requires IDOT certification and oversees the inspection of all county and township bridges. Coordinates biennial bridge inspections with county consultant.
- Perform special inspection of bridges when inspection cycle is less than two years. Performing special bridge inspections require IDOT certification.
- Resolves complaints promptly from private citizens and local government agencies regarding project inconveniences.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE

Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering from an accredited college.

A minimum of three years of experience performing roadway and/or bridge design and/or construction inspection.

Proficient use of AutoCad software desired.

Proficient use of Word and Excel software programs required.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS
